

Let's see what you're saying...

Cued Speech uses 8 hand shapes in 4 positions near the mouth. You Cue as you speak, so that your deaf child can see all the hidden sounds that you're saying and then they'll be able to learn your language. It only takes 20 hours to understand all you need to Cue any word you like. After that it's just practice — so lets get started!



You can use Cued Speech...



From birth.



Bilingually with British Sign Language



Before your child has implants.



After implants to support rehabilitation.



With hearing aids to clarify all the sounds of speech.



At school to support reading and writing.
